This year we saw for the first time the ADF contingent march in Mardi Gras wearing ceremonial uniform and medals to highlight the pride and inclusion felt by all. We marched to the beating drums of the Army Drum Corp and paraded the National Flags of Australia, Aboriginal First Nations and the Torres Strait Island National Flag. Signifying our commitment to amplify, support, empower people from all diverse backgrounds and people representing all Diverse, Sex, Sexuality and Gender in this year's parade. The ADF were again supported by the DEFGLIS contingent that expressed themselves to the choreography of Vince Chong and Nikki Rosendell. The colour of purple stood out and shone bright with glitter, lights and movement. I would like to personally express my thanks to the ADF contingent lead by GPCAPT Jenson who paraded us to the centre where we needed to mark time for a mammoth effort of 7:30 minutes. Royal Commission

After all the excitement of Mardi Gras and the success of the Rainbow Wreath Project, DEFGLIS was approached by members of the Royal Commission into Veterans Suicide, we were asked to participate in a submission that is currently being worked on. In these conversations it was decided that to support our community and assist the needs of the Royal Commission we held a Town Hall and invited all members to gather in a safe place to be addressed by members of the Royal Commission, to show that there is trust and respect for our community. The Royal Commission has identified that there is a greater depth to the risks and threats to our people and they understand that DEFGLIS can play a pivotal part in identifying and supporting members of the community that come forward to share their lived experiences. Long Range WorldPride2023

DEFGLIS is already working collaboratively to secure an amazing involvement in World-pride 2023. We are holding talks with the Executive Director Mardi Gras to ensure that we meet their creative needs whilst trying to shape and scope our involvement. For those that are unaware there are two marches next year, one on the 25th February, this will be the return of the street parade and all its sparkle. Then on the 5th March the Sydney Harbour Bridge will be closed for a march of solidarity and support to the community across the bridge, the first of its kind. What I can tell you about the 2 parades, the main MG PARADE will be what we all remember; however it will still be quite restricted in numbers, looking at 40 per float.
